RESOLUTION
PRESIDENTIAL INAUGURATION HOLIDAY

WHEREAS, The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission ("Commission") is designating Friday, January 20, 2017, the Presidential Inauguration Day as an official M-NCPPC holiday. This designation shall be considered a special additional holiday for this year only on the above-mentioned date, and shall not be considered a precedent for the treatment of future Inauguration Days, as any future action shall be determined by Commission at that time.

WHEREAS, the purpose of this special one-time designated holiday is to follow other area government agencies and school systems in preparation for the wide-spread visitation of the region from around the nation for this historic event,


WHEREAS, it is recognized that holidays may be a subject of negotiation as a working condition. The respective Unions have been advised of the intent to designate this special, additional holiday for this year only. The Commission shall move forward with the designation of this observed holiday for all Merit System and Term contract employees. Should either of the Unions wish to not participate in the observation of this designated holiday, it will be considered as a normal work day for its bargaining unit members.

WHEREAS, this holiday shall be available only to employees who are normally scheduled to work on January 20, 2017. Substitute and alternate holidays will not be made available. However, Merit and Term Contract employees who must remain at work due to critical duties, shall receive Holiday work pay for all work hours on this day.


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Friday, January 20, 2017, the Presidential Inauguration Day is designated as an official Commission holiday.
